From the Minister

Happy New Year!

No, you didn't miss December. It's not the beginning of a calendar year; it's the beginning of our church year. The church year begins with the first Sunday in Advent going through its own cycle of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Ordinary Time, Lent, Easter, Pentecost and more Ordinary Time.

Each church season has its own color, found in our church on the pulpit hangings and the minister's stoles. The color for Advent is usually purple, which represents the royal title of Prince of Peace that we give to Jesus. Some churches use blue, which is the color of waiting.

Advent is a time of new beginnings and a time of waiting. The scriptures tell us that this should be an "active" waiting. While we are waiting we should be preparing - not just the details of the celebration of Christmas, but preparing our hearts and our lives. We should be preparing ourselves by looking at our lives to see where we can move them closer to the path that Jesus has set out for us all.

The Advent wreath that we light every Sunday gives us four benchmarks to help re-focus our lives: hope, peace, joy and love. When we focus on hope, we are not so mired in negativity that we can't see the miracle that is about to happen and all the little miracles that happen every day. When we focus on peace, we can take time in the middle of the holiday rush for quiet conversations with loved ones, for making amends with anyone whom we have harmed or offended, and for time of solitude to reflect on the course of our life. When we focus on joy, we can find those things that are meaningful that bring quiet smiles to our faces. When we focus on love, we can strengthen our relationships with family and friends while reaching out to those we have never met, but who may be in need. This is how we should begin our new year in the season of Advent.



Unfortunately this month will also bring an ending as we will be saying good-bye to Tina Moore as our paid Sunday School Superintendent. Last summer Tina indicated a desire to move to a full time job. The CE Committee, the Trustees and the Church Council then made the difficult decision that for financial reasons we would not have the Sunday School Superintendent as a paid position beginning in 2011. Our very able CE Committee will pick up the tasks, but we will very much miss having Tina's competent and cheerful leadership of our Sunday School. We are very thankful for all that she has done for our children and we are blessed to have her continue as a member of our church.

Advent is a time of new beginnings and a time of active preparation. We have a full range of activities planned at church this month that include the mission fair, advent brunch, Christmas pageant, labyrinth walk, and much more all leading up to our beautiful candlelight service of lessons and carols on Christmas Eve. Come and prepare for the birth of our Lord.

May your advent be full of hope, peace, joy and love. May you have a blessed new year!

Sunday School Corner

We're almost to the midway point of our Sunday School year. The first through sixth graders have just finished a workshop rotation titled "Abraham and Sarah." Through art, science, video and storytelling workshops they learned about the ancestry of Jesus. Perhaps this got them thinking about their own ancestry. 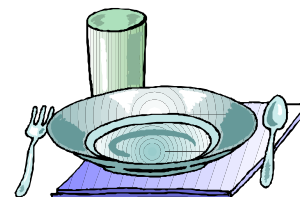

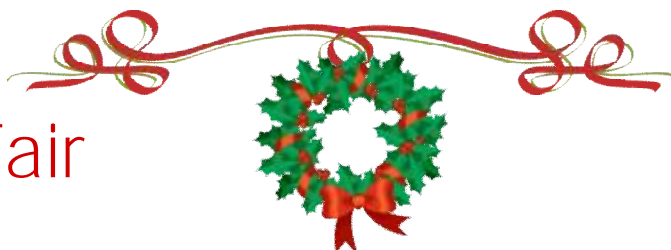
Eddy House Dinner: December 28

(Christians Caring for Creation)

Over the past months, our church has been converting from conventional cleaning products to earth-friendly cleaning products.

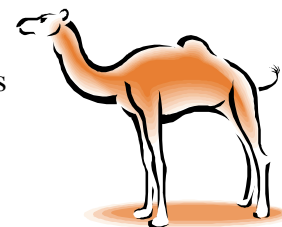
Most conventional cleaners contain dangerous ingredients which include volatile organic compounds (VOCs), formaldehyde, harsh acids, hormone disrupters linked to cancer, reproductive toxicity, and eye, skin and respiratory irritation. Some examples of ingredients to be avoided are ammonia, chlorinated bleach and synthetic fragrances. Green cleaners, on the other hand, are nontoxic, biodegradable, free of synthetic fragrances, and not tested on animals.

Alyson and some others have purchased a variety of green cleaners with brand names such as: Ecover, Citrosolve, Seventh Generation, Sun and Earth, EO, Mrs. Meyers, and BioKleen.

These preferred products may be found at supermarkets, hardware stores, and health food stores. Any donations of these green products would be very much appreciated.

CONGRATULATIONS to the Sunday School Children for raising \$425.00, enough money to purchase one camel.

Because of the extreme drought in Tanzania, Heifer camels are taking the place of cows by providing sweet nutritious milk, transportation, and income to communities. This income has enabled families to pay school fees for their children. The camels have lightened the women's workload considerably by carrying water and firewood.

Lions Club Food Drives

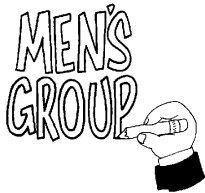

We are off to a very promising start of our Stewardship Campaign for 2011. As per November 28, we have received 70 pledges to a total value of \$86,978. Of these, 61 are returning pledges and nine are new. The returning pledges are in total \$4,866 or 6.4% higher than last year and the new ones represent a total additional amount of \$6,592. The average weekly pledge for the coming year is at this stage \$23.60 which is 10% higher than for 2010.

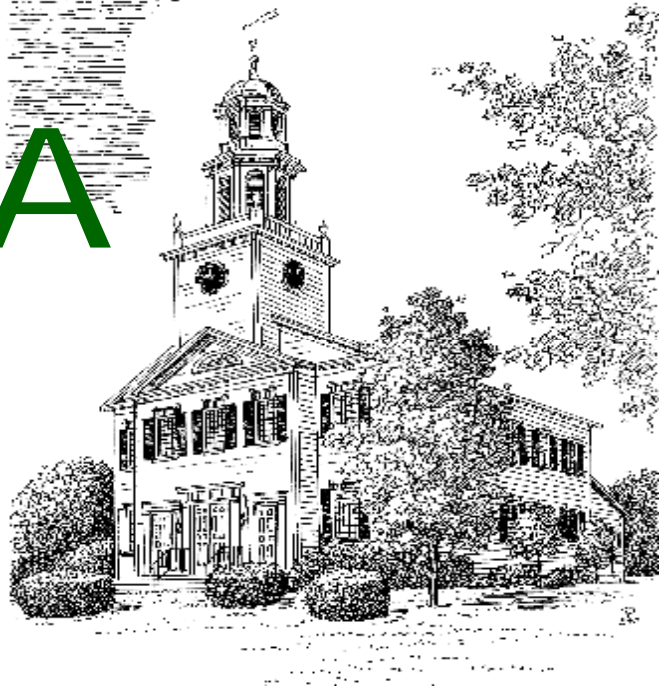
